# PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

## **6<sup>th</sup> Grade After-School**

1. A program that offers extra assistance with homework, organization and studying for the proficiency tests every Tuesday & Thursday.
2. **Tuesday and Thursday after school until 5:00 (except Hamilton ends @ 5:30)**
3. **RAP Room-**
4. Students do homework/test study tables for 40 min.
5. Students do curriculum-based work for 20 min.
6. Students work on life-skills, leadership and group activities
7. Each student receives a healthy snack
8. Structured recreational time (25 min.)

## **7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> Grade ~ Wednesdays**

1. A program that offers extra assistance with homework, organization, team building and for 5 area middle schools to meet once a week.
2. Wednesday after school for 3 hours
3. Students get on bus after school and go to Hoover Y Park.
4. Students do homework/test study tables for 30 min.
5. Students work on life-skills, leadership and group activities
6. Each student receives a healthy snack
7. Structured recreational time (25 min.)
8. Students are picked up by parents at school

## **7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade ~ Mondays**

1. Monday after school until 5:00.
2. RAP Room-
3. Students do homework/test study tables for 30 min.
4. Students work on life-skill projects
5. Students work on leadership and group activities
6. Each student receives a healthy snack

## **HAWK**

1. A program for high-energy youth who would benefit more from small group or one-on-one extra-help and a positive male or female role model and mentor.
2. Days vary from school to school. We will provide one-on-one mentoring/tutoring during lunch and/or study hall.
3. Each student will receive 45 min. of mentoring/tutoring every week. With quarterly team-building activities outside of school.
4. If a RAP student would benefit more from HAWK they will be referred out of RAP and into HAWK.

## **VIVA**

1. A program for students and parents of Hispanic descent, who need extra help with social or academic challenges, need to be involved in a positive extra-curricular activity and/or would benefit from a positive adult role model.
2. Schoolteachers, guidance counselors & administrators refer students.
3. Days vary from school to school. We will provide one-on-one mentoring/tutoring during lunch and/or study hall.
4. Each student will receive 45 min. of mentoring/tutoring every week. And will meet once a month with students from other schools.
5. We will provide monthly parent workshops for Hispanic families.
